All areas of communication will play a central role in the course. It is important to come prepared to participate each session and to make positive contributions to the class. There will be plenty of opportunities to practice speaking when discussing and providing feedback on each other's work.

Methods

Peer review; in-class discussions; presentations of work

Relevant texts and learning material will be provided in class.

Please note: The required proficiency level for this course is B2 (upper-intermediate) and a short placement test will be conducted in the first week to ensure all participants share this level.

The course will consist of a diverse mixture of doctoral candidates both culturally and in their own language abilities. We all have different strengths and weaknesses and it is best to keep an open mind and remember that we can all learn something from each other.
